Sights

Historic Center

Brussels has a very nice historic centre. Especially in the evening it is worth to take walk through the streets when the buildings are illuminated. The historic centre is around the *Grand Place* (Metro see below). The streets are mainly pedestrian area but partially road traffic is admitted.

You can find the find the typical crepe-stands who are selling waffles or chocalatiers as well as all kinds of restaurants, bars, cafes, pubs and chipples there.

The historic centre is ranged over several metro stations. It is worth to drop out in *Anneessens* oder *Bourse / Beurs* and to go to *Gare Central / Centraal Station* by foot.

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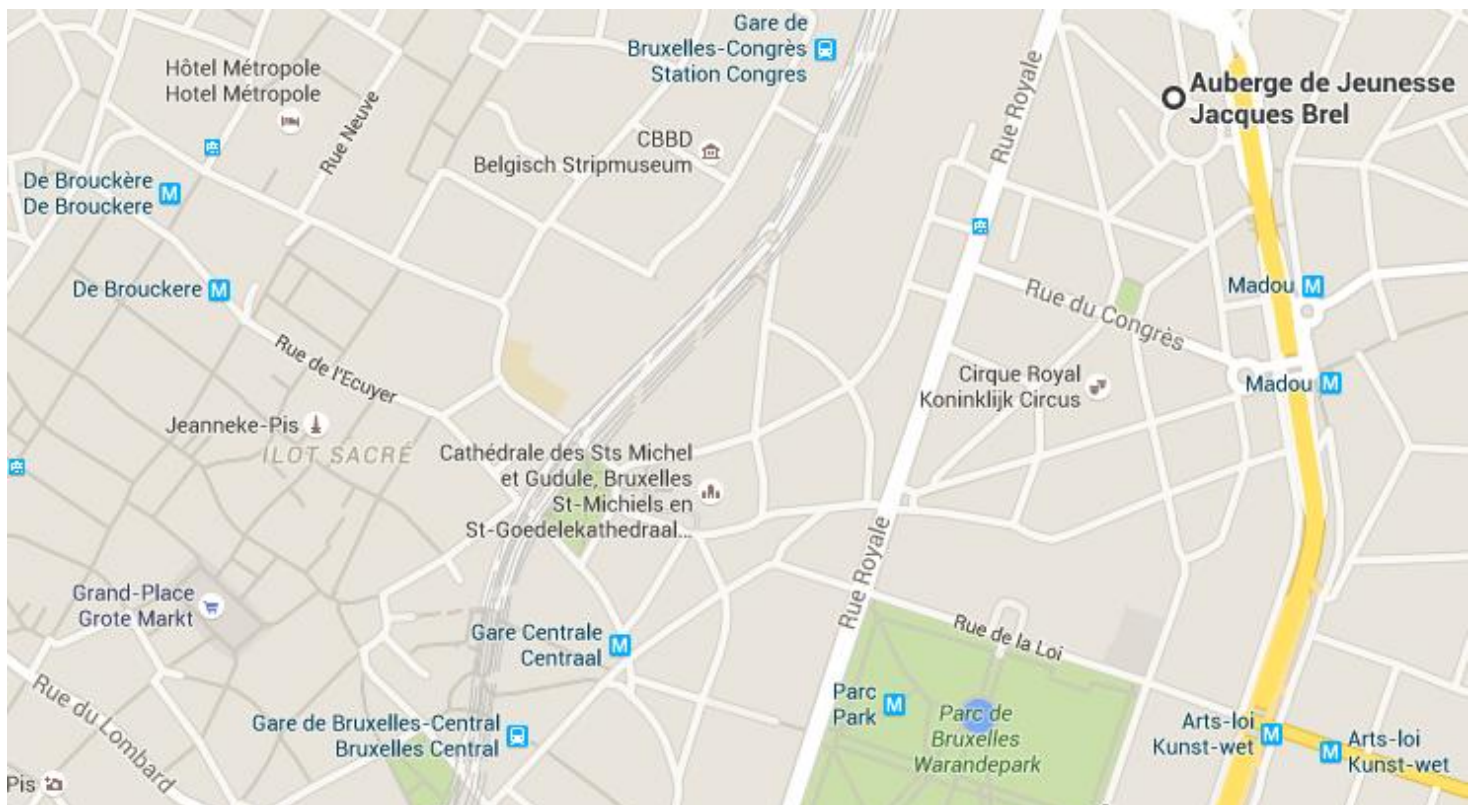

Metro: The nearest metro station is *Madou* or *Botanique/Kruidtuin*. If you are not lazy and you want to stretch your legs you can also drop off at *Park/Parc* or *Arts-Loi/Kunst-Wet* station. It takes you 10 to 12 minutes then. I personally would prefer to drop off at *Park/Parc* as you (amongst others) pass the *Bier-Circus* and you are invited for an „Absacker“.

Please be advised, that the Metro and Tram is only operating until 12pm and busses only until 1am in the night. But: According to google, even from *Grande Place* you can reach the youth hostel by foot in 13 minutes as it is only 1km.

For sporty people: Also a large part of interesting sights are within walking distance.



Useful information

Banks and money

Opening times 9am to 4 pm. Cas points are widely spread. Credit cards are accepted nearly everywhere.

Bike rental outlet

At about 25 spots in the center (e.g. *Gare Centrale, Place De Brouckère*) 250 rental bikes are placed. The basic charge amounts 1,50 €, the first half an hour is free of charge, then you pay an appropriate charge. You have to pay by credit card. More information under <http://en.villo.be>

Internetcafés & WiFi

WiFi zones or hotspots are proposed by the Brussels Capital Region (Urbizone), cafes, hotels, fastfood restaurants, train stations, gas stations, etc on the territory of the City of Brussels. Some of these wifi zones have free access and are free of charge. Others can only be used by customers. A login and password might be asked.

Taxi

Taking a taxi in Brussels is quite straight forward if you are in the city centre. There are many taxi stands on the side of the main streets so you can identify them easily. You can wave a taxi if it is free ("I" in roman numerals means it is free). You can also call for a taxi in advance. Taxis come in all shapes and sizes without any markings on the car doors so look out for the white, yellow and blue triangular stand at the top to spot one on the street. All taxis are metered and you do not need to tip, although rounding up to the nearest euro is sometimes acceptable. The standard fares will change over time; right now it is 2,40 € flag-fall and 1,35 € per km within the 19 communes and 2,70 € per km outside. A 2,00 € surcharge applies between 10pm and 6am.

Tip

Prices in restaurants and cafes are including 17 percent service charge. Small tips are only common if you pay cash.
